The same joy and emotion fill the hearts of the entire hierarchy, the holy clergy, and the faithful of the Holy Archdiocese, especially


those of the Holy Metropolis of Atlanta, which has gained a new shepherd in the person of the beloved Metropolitan Sevastianos.

Finally, it is announced that the enthronement of His Eminence Metropolitan Sevastianos of Atlanta will take place on Saturday, January 25, 2025, at the Holy Cathedral of the Annunciation in Atlanta. We all express our gratitude and thanks to our Mother Church of Constantinople and personally to its illustrious 34-year Primate, His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, and the Holy and Sacred

Synod for their attentive ear to the unanimous plea and proposal of the Archbishop, the members of our Holy Eparchial Synod, the clergy and the laity, as well as of His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios himself, for the election of His Eminence Metropolitan Sevastianos, succeeding his venerable and respected predecessor.
